

Common Council Meeting – 7 June 2011

A regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Prairie du Chien was held on Tuesday June 7th 2011 at 7:00 PM in the Council Chambers of City Hall. Mayor Dave Hemmer called the meeting to order. **Call to order/Roll Call** – All present **Certification of the open meeting law agenda requirements** – ACTION: To certify MOTION: Munson SECOND: Ames VOTE: 12-0 **Pledge of Allegiance** – Led by Sharon Boylen

I. PUBLIC HEARINGS, PRESENTATIONS, AND INPUT

A. DISCUSSION AND ACTION – Update on Hoffman Hall Fundraising Campaign

Pam Ritchie, chairperson of the Fundraising Campaign, addressed the Council, as did Rory Meisner (3M Corporation), Jason Knapp (Cabella's) and Bill Sexton (Prairie du Chien Memorial Hospital). Sexton informed the Council the hospital is making a 3-year, \$100,000-per-year commitment to the fundraising campaign. Solomon questioned Ritchie on the overall fundraising campaign, but Ritchie said the campaign is not at the stage where it is prepared to release specific numbers, but she did add that those involved are encouraged by the progress so far. No official action was taken.

B. DISCUSSION AND ACTION – Request for City Support on Barge Terminal on St. Feriole Island :

Kathleen Sackett (Director of Sales and Marketing, Wisconsin and Southern Railroad) and Tim Stowasser (Regional Manager, Hanke Trucking) were present seeking city support for the construction of a barge terminal on St. Feriole Island, south of the Highway 18 bridge. The terminal would not result in additional truck traffic on St. Feriole Island. ACTION: To direct staff to issue a letter of support for the proposal MOTION: Titlbach SECOND: Ames VOTE: 12-0

The City Administrator provided an update on the status of the three requirements approved by the Council last month for the city to provide \$845,000 in assistance to the project. He stated that two of the three conditions had been met in full, and the third, the city's contribution be spent last as the convention center develops, was still be negotiated. ACTION: To direct staff to negotiate with the bank that a budget for the project be presented, and that the city's \$500,000 be the last funds spent on the convention center component of the budget MOTION: Riebe SECOND: Boylen VOTE: 5-5 (Thein, Wayne, Solomon, Fleshner, Munson opposed). RESOLUTION 2011-24

AUTHORIZING APPLICATION FOR A SECTION 404-HAZARD MITIGATION GRANT PROGRAM DISASTER GRANT FOR ACQUISITION

A **RESOLUTION** authorizing the submittal of a grant application to the Section 404-Hazard Mitigation Grant Program for acquisition of flood impacted properties.

WHEREAS, the **City of Prairie du Chien** recognizes the need to remove structures from the regulatory floodway; and

WHEREAS, in this action the **City of Prairie du Chien** will ensure that participation by property owners is voluntary. The prospective participants have been informed in writing that participation in the program is voluntary and that the sub-applicant will not use its eminent domain authority to acquire the property should negotiations fail; and

WHEREAS, the **City of Prairie du Chien** will accept all of the requirements of the FEMA grant and the deed restriction governing the use of the land, as restricted in perpetuity to open-space uses; and

WHEREAS, the **City of Prairie du Chien** will allow employees from FEMA and the Wisconsin Department of Military Affairs access to inspect the grant site or facility and grant records; and

IT IS, THEREFORE RESOLVED THAT:

The City of Prairie du Chien Common Council requests funds and assistance available through the Section 404-Hazard Mitigation Grant Program in the amount of \$259,875, will comply with all rules and regulations for the program, and will provide matching funds for the grant of \$37,125; and

HEREBY AUTHORIZES the **City Administrator** to act on the behalf of the **City of Prairie du Chien** to: submit an application to the Section 404-Hazard Mitigation Grant Program for financial aid for allowable purposes, sign documents, and take necessary action to undertake, direct, and complete approved grant activities.

RESOLUTION 2011-25

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF APPROXIMATELY \$575,000
GENERAL OBLIGATION PROMISSORY NOTES, SERIES 2011**

WHEREAS the City of Prairie du Chien, Crawford County, Wisconsin (the "City") is in need of the sum of approximately \$575,000 for public purposes including paying the cost of purchasing a fire truck; and

WHEREAS it is desirable to authorize the issuance of general obligation promissory notes for such purpose pursuant to Section 67.12(12), Wisconsin Statutes;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City of Prairie du Chien, Crawford County, Wisconsin, that:

Section 1. Issuance of Notes. The Common Council hereby authorizes the issuance of approximately \$575,000 General Obligation Promissory Notes, Series 2011 for the above-mentioned purposes and there shall be levied on all the taxable property of the City a direct, annual, irrevocable tax sufficient to pay the interest on said Notes as it becomes due, and also to pay and discharge the principal thereof within ten years of the date of issuance of the Notes. At a subsequent meeting, the Common Council shall consider such proposals for the Notes as may have been received and take action thereon.

Section 2. Official Statement. The City Clerk shall cause an Official Statement concerning this issue to be prepared by the City's financial advisor, Public Financial Management, Inc. The appropriate City officials shall determine when the Official Statement is final for purposes of Securities and Exchange Commission Rule 15c2-12 and shall certify said Statement, such certification to constitute full authorization of such Statement under this resolution.

Section 3: That Section 1.49 of the Municipal Code of the City of Prairie du Chien, Crawford County, Wisconsin, is hereby repealed and recreated to read as follows:

1.49 (ALDERMANIC DISTRICTS)

The City of Prairie du Chien, Crawford County, Wisconsin, is hereby divided into six (6) Aldermanic Districts comprised from the seven (7) Wards which constitute the City of Prairie du Chien as described in Section 1.48 of the Municipal Code of the City of Prairie du Chien and said six (6) Aldermanic Districts are specifically created and described as follows:

- (1) **The First Aldermanic District** shall consist of the First Ward as described in Section 1.48 of the Municipal Code.
- (2) **The Second Aldermanic District** shall consist of the Second and Seventh Wards as described in Section 1.48 of the Municipal Code.
- (3) **The Third Aldermanic District** shall consist of the Third Ward as described in Section 1.48 of the Municipal Code.
- (4) **The Fourth Aldermanic District** shall consist of the Fourth Ward as described in Section 1.48 of the Municipal Code.
- (5) **The Fifth Aldermanic District** shall consist of the Fifth Ward as described in Section 1.48 of the Municipal Code.
- (6) **The Sixth Aldermanic District** shall consist of the Sixth Ward as described in Section 1.48 of the Municipal Code.

Section 4: That Section 1.50 of the Municipal Code for the City of Prairie du Chien, Crawford County, Wisconsin, is hereby repealed and recreated to read as follows:

1.50 (COUNTY SUPERVISORY DISTRICTS)

The City is divided into County Supervisory Districts to be described and numbered as follows:

- (1) FIRST COUNTY SUPERVISORY DISTRICT - The First Ward.
- (2) SECOND COUNTY SUPERVISORY DISTRICT - The Second and Seventh Wards.
- (3) THIRD COUNTY SUPERVISORY DISTRICT - The Third Ward.
- (4) FOURTH COUNTY SUPERVISORY DISTRICT - The Fourth Ward.
- (5) FIFTH COUNTY SUPERVISORY DISTRICT - The Fifth Ward.
- (6) SIXTH COUNTY SUPERVISORY DISTRICT - The Sixth Ward.

Section 5: Any Ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 6: This Ordinance shall be effective from November 15th 2011, and after its passage and publication as required by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 2011-17

REPEALING AND RECREATING SECTION 12.02 (5) (b) OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF PRAIRIE DU CHIEN, CRAWFORD COUNTY, WISCONSIN (CLASS B FERMENTED MALT BEVERAGE LICENSES)

The Common Council of the City of Prairie du Chien, Crawford County, Wisconsin, do ordain as follows:

Section 1: That Section 12.02 (5) (b) of the Municipal Code of the City of Prairie du Chien, Crawford County, Wisconsin, is hereby repealed and recreated to read as follows:

(b) Class "B" Fermented Malt Beverages. \$100.00 per year or \$50.00 for six (6) months; a six (6)-month license may not be renewed in the same calendar year.

Section 4: Any Ordinance or parts thereof, inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 3: This Ordinance shall be effective from and after its passage and publication as required by law.
