B. FINANCE - Resolution 2013-12 (ESTABLISHING AN EQUIPMENT REPLACEMENT AND INFRASTRUCTURE FUND AND DESIGNATING FUTURE BUDGET SURPLUSES)

This resolution outlines a series of policies and new finance and budget goals, including a plan to address the unfunded Compensated Absences (retirement and termination payouts) liability, and investment of any future budget surpluses in an Equipment Replacement and Infrastructure Fund.

C. FINANCE - Professional Services Agreement with MSA to perform traffic counts for the nine at-grade rail crossings. Information is necessary to maintain quiet zone status

A memo from City Planner Frable is included in the packet. The cost for the traffic counts (\$6,300) would be divided between the City’s TIF Districts (\$1,260) and the Contingency Fund (\$5,040).

D. PUBLIC WORKS/FINANCE – Approval of Bids for Bituminous Paving, Concrete and Seal Coating

At its April 1st meeting, the Committee recommended that the following bids be approved: Bituminous Paving (Iverson Construction), Seal Coating (Fahrner Asphalt) and Curb and Gutter and Sidewalk Replacement (JT Concrete)

E. PUBLIC WORKS - Water Leak Survey (Informational Item Only)

The Water Department advertised for quotes on the performance of a water leak survey on the water distribution system. The proposal was to have a sound survey on all hydrants and correlate with accessible line valves to locate all leaks and mark in the field, submit report with diagrams of all leaks found and recommendations/observations where appropriate. The City of Prairie du Chien has 55.6 miles of metallic piping which needs to have a leak survey perform upon. There are 318 fire hydrants and 590 main valves in the water system. The City received 4 quotes from responsive companies. The low quote was from Municipal Management Corp. from Madrid, Iowa for the amount of \$3,395.00. This certain company has performed a water leak survey for the City in past years and is highly recommended. This bid is below the threshold needed for Council action, and the bid has been awarded so work can begin.

Bill Sexton has indicated he is willing to serve as the Independent Hearing Officer, and staff would recommend his appointment by the Council.

This will begin the financing phase of the 22nd Street Development project. An additional component – installing curb and gutter, and widening Campion Boulevard from 18th to 22nd Streets – has been added to the project for the Council to consider.

Staff presented several options for the possible layout of streets and lots in the proposed 22nd Street subdivision at the Committee's April 1st meeting. The Committee met earlier this evening to choose a final design.
