| 2.) Does the well and pump installation meet the requirements of NR 812 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code? | No | Well Permit is denied and well must be abandoned (at owner's expense). DNR Well Abandonment Form (3300-005) must be obtained. |

| 3.) Does the well produce two (2) safe bacti water samples?
(2 samples are required with a minimum of 2 weeks between samples) | No | Well Permit is denied and well must be abandoned. |

| 4.) Is the piping from the well disconnected from the public water system? | No | The piping must not be connected to the public water system in any way. |
| | Yes | Continue to Question #5 |

| 5.) Has the owner submitted an application for a private Well Permit? | No | Owner is required to obtain a Well Permit for the private well. |
| | Yes | Permit application must be signed/dated by the owner and submitted along with two (2) bacti-safe reports, a letter from a licensed well & pump installer approving the private well system and a \$10.00 permit fee. Well Permits are issued for a period of 5 years, at which time a new permit must be issued. |
